## The 2014 AGM—Black Cockatoo Bush Camp, Naracoorte, S.A.

Like many of our travelers, Sherol and I left Queensland in late September to head towards Black Cockatoo, and the start of our full time life on the road. We originally planned on arriving there on the 20th October, but sped things up a bit on our travels down through NSW and Victoria, arriving at Black Cockatoo on the 13th October. When we arrived, we were greeted by Tom Rundle, who had already been in attendance since the 6th October. We found a nice spot to set up camp, near some trees but not directly underneath them, not too far from the toilets and showers, with our own campfire site. It wasn't long before first Liz and then Ken Yelland, our campsite owners and hosts came around and made us welcome, followed not long after by the resident handyman Trevor. Ken and Trevor over the next two and a half weeks made sure that we had every-

thing we needed, especially logs for the campfires. On Wednesday Soren and Sandy arrived and set up camp next to us and that night we enjoyed the first of our many campfires and camp oven meals.

Ken Yelland took each of us in turn around the whole property, which used to be a commercial yabbie farm run by Ken and Liz, until the Gumbymint in their wisdom, revoked a number of water licences, including Ken's, and they were forced to close down the business. Since then he had turned some of the yabbie ponds into 4WD competition tracks for use by 4WD clubs, and established the campground, including installing toilets, showers with solar and gas instantaneous hot water, and a RV dump site.

By Sunday a few more rigs and people had arrived, and they continued to dribble in over the coming days until by Thursday the 23rd 65 caravans and motorhomes were onsite, as well as a couple of members who ridden their bikes and another couple in their car. All up, we had 133 people present, an excellent turnout considering the distance and also that it was our first bush camp AGM. It was good to catch up with plenty of old friends and also make new ones, as Ken and I toured the site on Thursday and Friday collecting



camp fees and meal fees from everyone present. The inclusion this year of a \$5.00 a head registration levy instead of having raffles was very well received, and that covered the shortfall in some meal costs and also a \$100 donation to the Naracoorte Hospital for the firewood.

On that topic, at a meeting of the State Coordinators on Saturday morning, a suggestion was put forward and adopted that for all future AGM's, where there are catering costs and the registration levy, that payment will be required at the time of registration, and that will be set up online with the registration form. This year, due to late cancellations during the actual AGM week, or people not turning up, we had to make up the shortfall of \$180 to the Hospital ladies for the Saturday lunch and another \$100 to Hoppy and Hobbit for the Friday and Saturday night meals.



On the subject of meals, Hoppy and his volunteer band of helpers provided us with mouth watering delights, with the biggest hamburgers any one of us had laid eyes on for our Friday night dinner, and then on Saturday night a huge serving of possibly one of the nicest Spaghetti Bolognese dishes I have ever tasted. Everyone that I saw came away from those two meals with huge smiles on their faces, and many took half of their spag bol back to their vans to have as a complete meal the next day.

On Thursday evening, Hoppy and the crew cooked up a serving of pancakes, free for anyone who wanted to partake, and whilst most of the campers present availed themselves of this offer, Hobbit, Vicki and I did a spot of entertaining with our ukuleles and guitar, with hopefully some in-tune singing. A few people clapped, so some of them must have enjoyed it.

Sunday morning dawned another beautiful day, and by lunchtime, quite a few of the attendees had packed up and fled the area, with more to follow on Monday and Tuesday, so that by Wednesday just Tom, Sandy and Soren, Gerry, Sherol and I were left. It was sort of like déjà vu in reverse.

Many members took the opportunity whilst in the area to visit the caves, or head down to Mt. Gambier and check out the Blue Lake and the sunken gardens, with many of the eastern Staters opting to explore South Australia on leaving Naracoorte.

Finally, it was time to bid farewell to our friends Sandy and Soren, and Gerry who left just before us, bid goodbye to our hosts and say hooroo to Tom, leaving the campground with just him there as we found it two and a half weeks earlier. On a parting note, Ken Yelland and Trevor informed me that they had driven over the entire site and did not have to pick up a single scrap of rubbish after everyone had left, which amazed and impressed them, as usually they spend a day cleaning up after a group has left.

And so on to Cobar next year, and in the meantime, for Sherol and I, some exploring of South Australia until after Christmas, and then to Parkes for the Elvis Festival. See you on the road.
