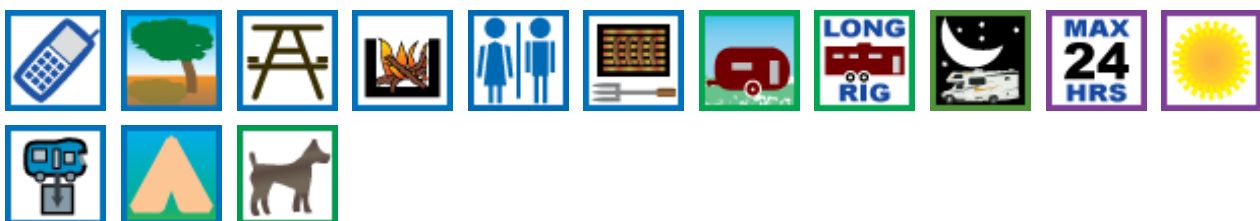

From here if you wish to continue you could head onto WILUNA (CP) and then across to MEEKATHARRA. Gravel road.

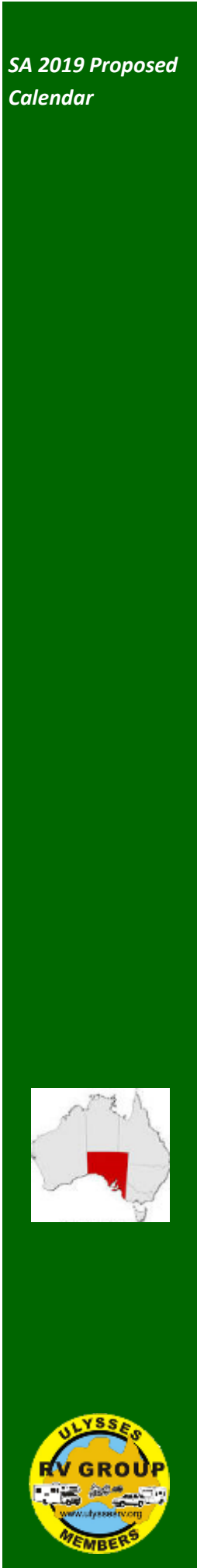

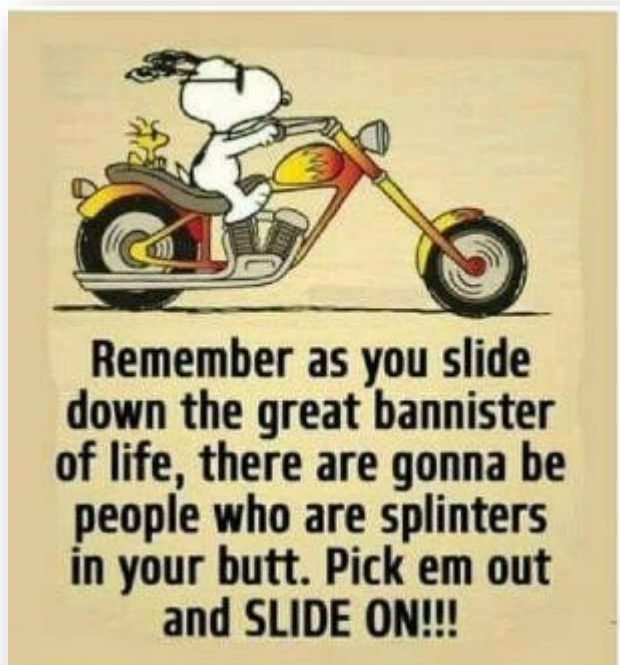
