Well enough from me at the moment, sitting up in Townsville till end of January, looking after our grandkids.

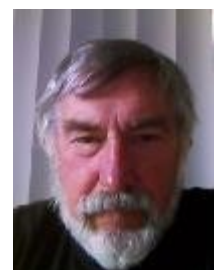
Wherever you are, we hope you are safe with the fires everywhere.

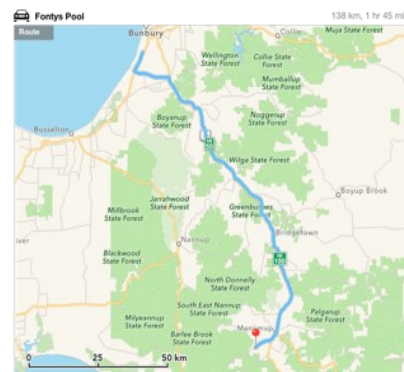

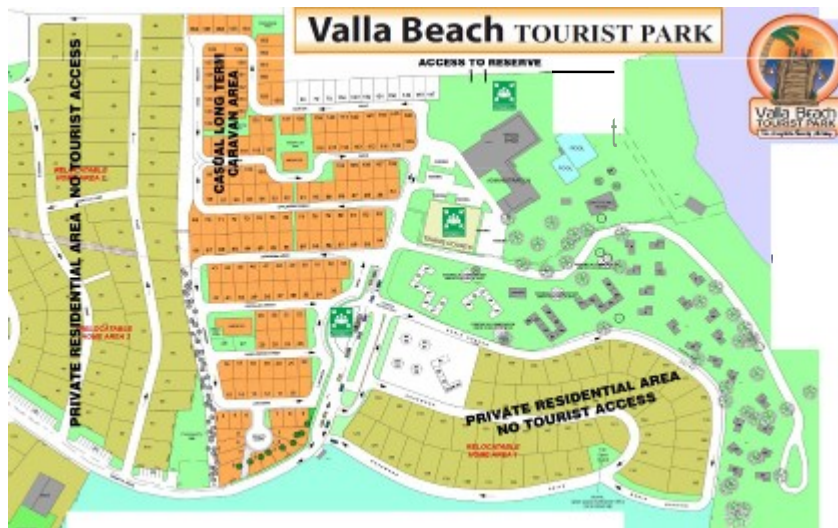

Camping Quesadillas

Ingredients

- 4 medium flour tortillas
- 2 8oz chicken breasts, grilled and sliced
- 1 jar Tostitos salsa con queso
- 1 can black beans rinsed and drained
- 1 c. shredded Mexican blend cheese
- tin foil

Instructions

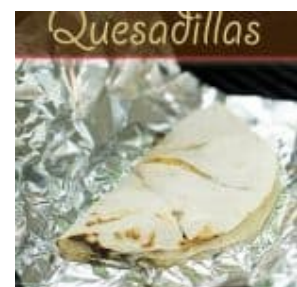
Spread 1 Tbsp salsa con queso over one side of a tortilla.

Place 1/4 c. chicken on half the tortilla over the salsa con queso. Sprinkle 1/4 c. black beans and about 1/4 c. cheese over the chicken.
