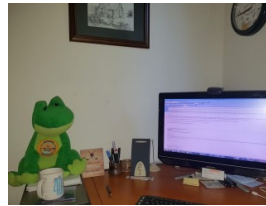

Our NSW Coordinators have recently visited Mudgee to check it out. It will still be held at Mudgee AREC Centre on Ulan Rd (about 2km from town).

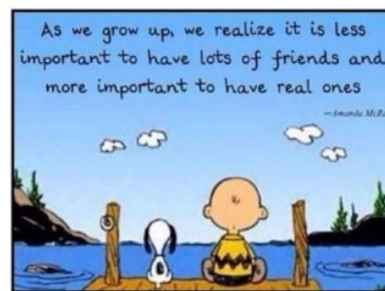
Lots of wineries to visit in the area, and some other great towns nearby. There will be more information posted as things are sorted, so stay tuned to this Bat Channel ...

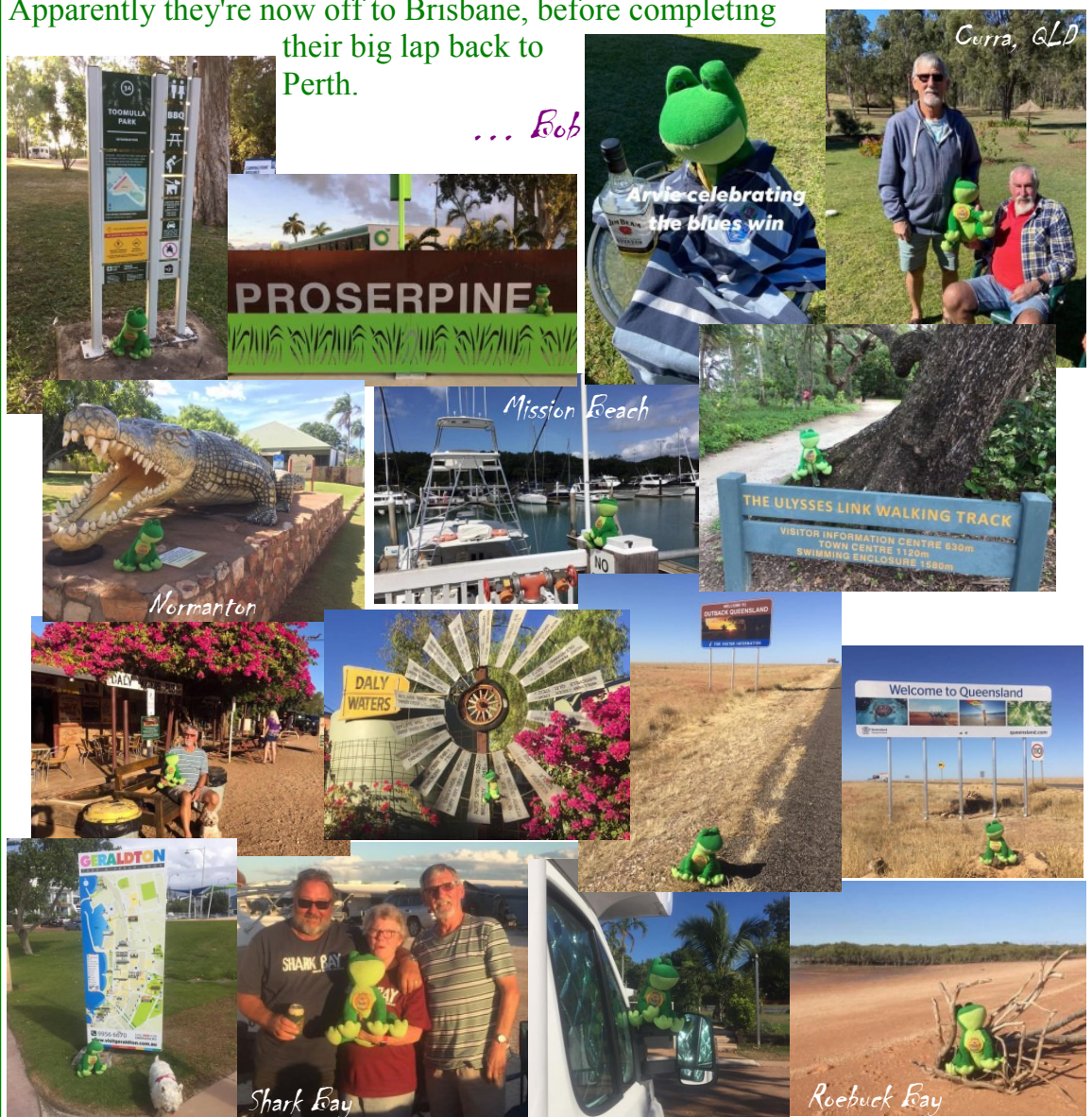

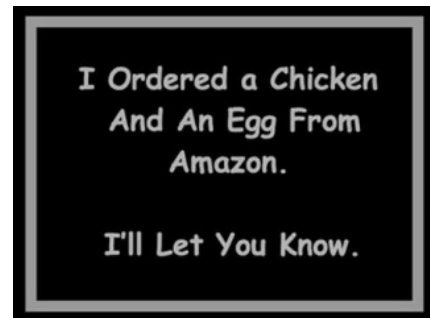

Registrations continue to trickle in, and I realise that there is some uncertainty, even now, over Covid. However, we don't pay our providers any money till a week or so from the event, so come on you lot, get registering!!

Accommodation ... All powered sites at the park are booked, and there is a waiting list for any that are cancelled. A small few have still not yet paid the park a deposit for their site, so to them I say, please give the park a call ASAP and confirm you want the site. From July we will have to review any remaining unpaid.

There are still plenty of unpowered sites available in the park. Call the park direct to book one!

For those who can free camp, the park is close to the Gunbower forest, which is a State park and has free camping available. Just remember, **no pets allowed in the park.**

Cohuna has a 72-hour free camp adjacent to the park, and the Shire has kindly allowed members attending the AGM to extend that stay by an additional 48 hours! It is on a first-come basis, and you must be totally self contained. There is also a procedure for registering for the extended time, which I'll advise closer to the AGM.

Want to stay longer? Then also try the Leitchville free camp just 15 minutes away.

Booking ... We use an online programme that lets you choose your options and book seamlessly. This one does not take any commission or require your credit card etc. We pay a small yearly fee to access the system. It's not perfect however, and I have had to disable allowing you to book more than once, as it was sometimes sending duplicating bookings! It solved the problem, but ... if you have already registered and want to change your options, like adding another event, then you just need to email us with your request and we will change it and advise the cost for payment.

There may eventually be a fix, and I'll work on it before Mudgee to resolve.

This year we're going green! Well, trying to reduce paper use anyway! When you book you will be asked if you would allow texts to be sent for the duration of the AGM only. We will send you the full programme as a text for reference, and also a short daily programme each day as a reminder. It will also be useful to advise when events are starting etc. Won't be too many, as I'll have to write them ☺.

PLACES TO EAT

Simple Guide to Snacks, meals and all things food in the area :-

The first thing to say is ... if you are a connoisseur of Macca's, KFC, Hungry Jacks etc, then this is NOT the place for you! Nearest junk food outlets are in Echuca, about 45 minutes drive.

However there are a few alternates, and some really nice and reasonably priced places to eat.

So lets get started :-

Breakfast

Starting with coffee, we hope to have a mobile coffee trailer visit us most days. Still discussing, but if we do then please do patronise it occasionally, as there will be no costs to the group for this facility - other than the cost of a hot fresh coffee!

If food is preference then there is a choice of takeaway at the takeaway, Birds Bakery, the Liberty servo or The Old Pharmacy Café.

Sit down is also available at the Old Pharmacy. On the weekend you can also get breakfast at the Bower Tavern, and Waffles.

Lunch in town could be at The Bower, Old Pharmacy, and the Ice Cream shop also does lunch-time meals. Or try one of the delicious and decadent waffles ... at Waffles of course!

In the local area when it's lunchtime there are some great little drives which can include lunch!

Pyramid Hill, The Bank is quirky and has a good range at reasonable prices.

Gunbower offers the Workshop café. Again, good range at reasonable pricing.

Kerang has a range of cafés, and Gray's Bakery is my favourite for a sandwich or pie, with outdoor seating under the vines.

Of course you may have gone for a day out in Echuca or Barham or further. We hope to have some further recommendations to share closer to the rally.

Now, Dinner

Walking distance gives you limited choice, but the Bower has nice meals, but I recommend you book ahead.

If you wish to drive, then within 20minutes there are lots of choices:-

Leitchville Hotel - large serves and a large menu of Aussie staples at good prices. About 10 minutes drive

Gunbower Hotel is your choice if you like steaks. The owner is also a butcher and farmer. Renowned enough to be recommended in The Age newspaper down in Melbourne, about 15 minutes drive.

Kerang has a choice of pubs and restaurants within 20 minutes.

Barham has the Services Club for basic club food, and pokies if that is your preference. Also in Barham is a Thai restaurant which is BYO and highly recommended.

OK, can't be bothered going out except to pick up takeaway? Then fish 'n chips from the take-

away ... but my favourite, the Caltex West End servo for fish 'n chips.

Fridays sees a mobile pizza usually hanging around the water tower.

But remember, the rally is a while off, so this is just to entice you to book if you haven't, and if you have, then thank you, and we'll see you next October.

Oh, and you won't need to worry about several evenings, as we have a welcome BBQ, dinner dance (hopefully), and formal rally dinner all in planning.

ULYSSES RV GROUP QUEENSLAND RALLY REPORT

MT UNCLE RV RETREAT

FAR NORTH QLD 19-24 May '21

An exciting adventure was in store for the 25 RV'ers who took advantage of the invitation to attend the FNQ Rally organised by member Steffany, and coordinated through our Queensland team. The effort put in by Steffany with the RV Retreat Manager, Bruce, food providers, creating our COVID plan, and coordinating with local residents with knowledge and expertise of the area, was very much appreciated.

The journey north had some members including it on their itineraries of travel, as they were already on the road. Some made it a single event travelling to and from the event, and others added to the rally by staying an extra few days to take in the sights, or visit the Rotary Far North Queensland Field Day at Mareeba.

Day of arrival was Wednesday, our settling in day, with introductions and explanations of the organised activities by Steffany. The Mt Uncle RV Retreat was definitely that – Peacocks and Guinea fowls wandering the grounds, donkeys, llamas, geese, and a cow in a fenced area all set between banana plantations and tropical gardens beside the Mt Uncle Distillery.

A real treat was in store on Thursday, with a local resident John Hardy OAM giving a documentary of the Historical War Sites on the tablelands as we travelled in a bus

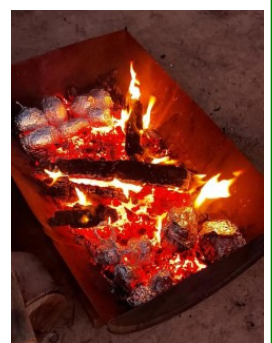
Australian Trivia on Thursday afternoon showed us all how much we don't know about Australia!

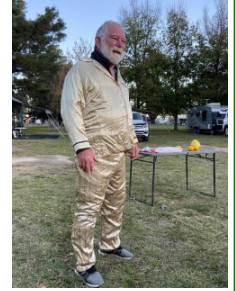
We even managed to blow the main electrical fuse at the showground with our heating demands!

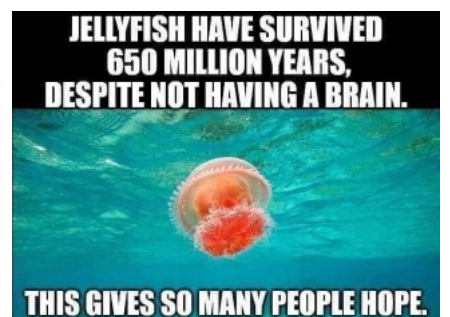

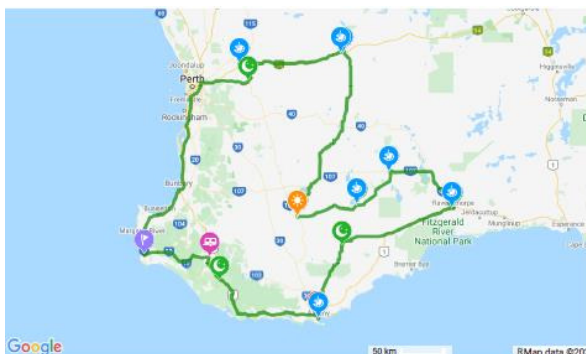
