*Ken had intended to write his own report for this edition, but has been far too unwell in recent times to get his mind together and put pen to paper, so I'm penning this to advise all our members the reason for no KT's Report in the past two editions (yes, I spun you a yarn about his knee replacement back in the September edition!).*



*I know you would all want to join myself and Marilyn in offering our prayers, love and strength, and wishing Ken and Doreen the best possible support and comfort, in their continuing battle to preserve and prolong their time together.*

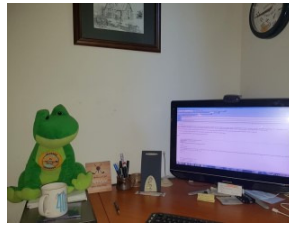

G'day folk,

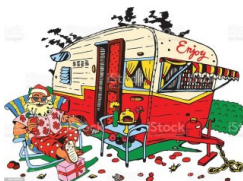


Yes, I've given Ken the front page of this edition, and having read that, you should now understand why.

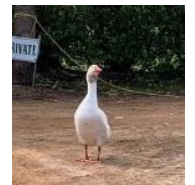
**UMRV -WA RALLY REPORT – September Silo Tag-A-Long**

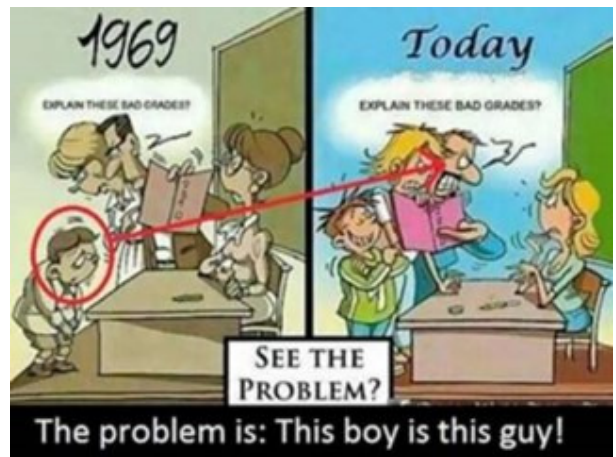
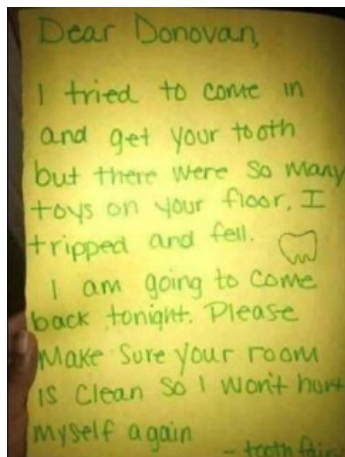
