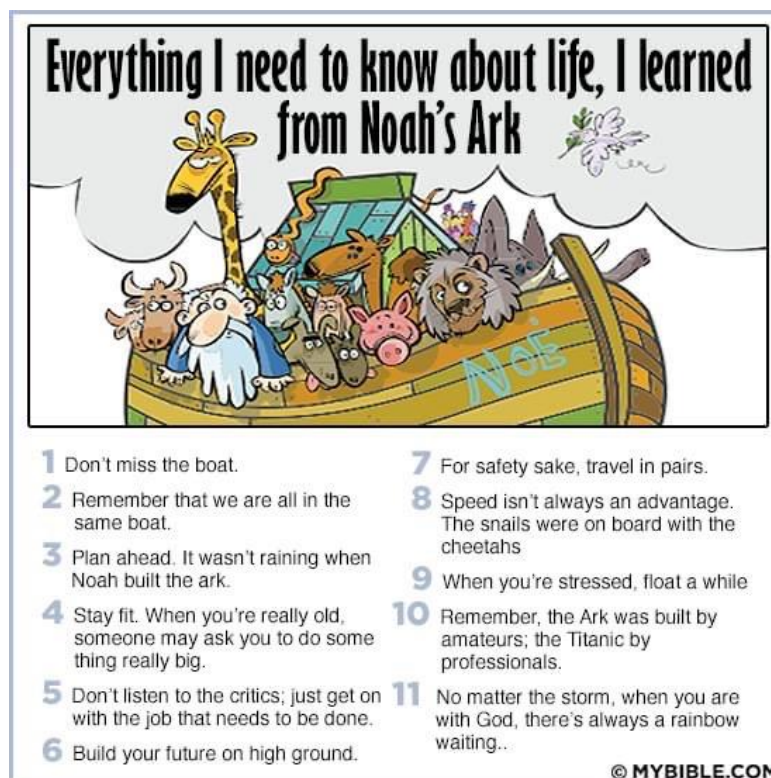
Editorial

Mudgee is a town in the central west of New South Wales, Australia. It is in the broad fertile Cudgegong River valley 261 km NW of Sydney and is the largest town in the Mid-Western Regional Council local government area as well as being the council seat.

As at Jun 18 its population was 12,410. The district lies across the edge of the geological structure known as the Sydney Basin.

Mudgee has developed as a wine producing region, it has manufacturing and repair industries. It also heavily depends on several major mines in the surrounding area and fly-in-fly-out (FIFO) miners who live in the town but work elsewhere.

Other rural produce includes cattle, sheep, wheat, alfalfa, fruit, tomatoes, sweetcorn, honey and dairy products which do not play as an important role as mining.

Notable people include - Natarsha Belling (CH10), Felicity Brown (Milner), Kim Currie (Chef), Jamie Fitzgerald (professional NRL with 71 games), Darrel Hair (International Cricket Umpire), Lisa Keightly (first woman to score a century at Lord's in England), Ken Sutcliffe (CH(9.))

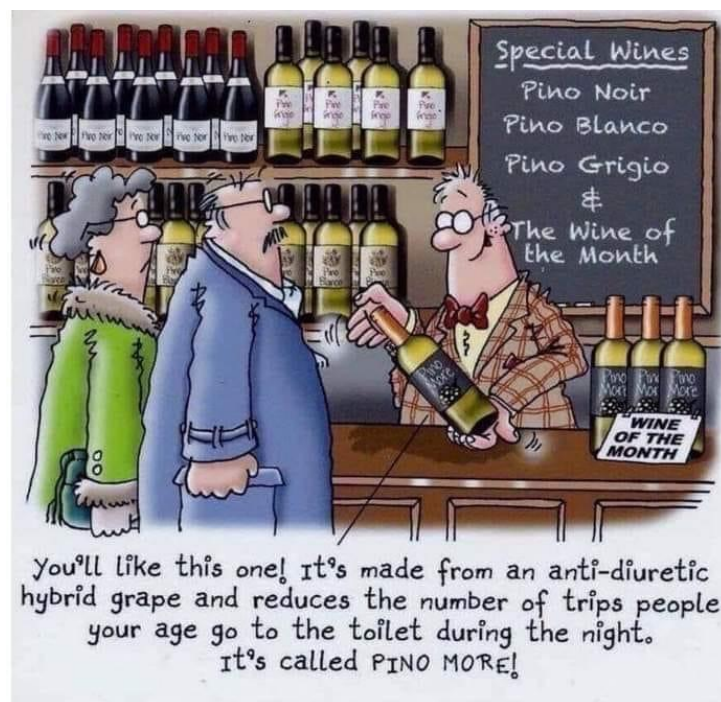



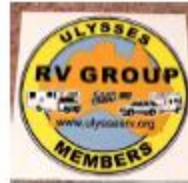
