Hi all, the time is fast approaching for our National Rally in Longford Tasmania this October. We hope everyone has secured their booking on the Spirit of Tasmania, if not you can always go on a waiting list for space that may be freed up because of a cancellation etc. These things do happen, so ring and enquire on 132010.

But wait, all is not lost. AutoRent has recently come on board and has offered discount rates to our members coming to our National Rally. AutoRent Launceston offers a wide range of Motorhomes, Campers and SUV cars for rent and is pleased to help us.

Just to let you know, rental rates are set fairly low at the moment, but as the year goes on and availability weakens, prices WILL RISE before October. Getting in early will reward you with an extra discount too. So book as soon as you can and you will be given 10% discount off the current price and if you book at least 90 days prior to your hire date you will receive an additional 5% off the current price, giving a total of 15% discount.

To book, simply go to the website <u>www.autorent.com.au</u> and use ULYSSES as the Promo Code to receive these discounts. On the website you will see the available dates for these discounts are set from the 1<sup>st</sup> of September to the 30<sup>th</sup> of November. But if you are staying here for longer than these dates please ring 1300 067 222 and AutoRent will help you to extend your rental dates and the discounts will definitely be honoured by AutoRent.

Note, AutoRent is right next to the Launceston Airport and you will be helped with your transfer too.

Next, make sure you have booked your site at our caravan park — The Longford Riverside Caravan Park phone 03 6391 1470. Sites are filling up and they are not reserving them for us, so get in quick. Last year's prices are being held for us and you will need to pay a deposit to book, which is fully refundable if you need to cancel up to two weeks prior.
