Attention keen fishers: around the Longford area, the Cressy area and up in the highland lakes are some fantastic trout fishing areas. Bring your rod, reel and lures to catch a big one while here in Tassie.

One of our guest speakers will be from the Longford fishing club (oldest fishing club in Tasmania) and will tell t you all the secrets of trout fishing in Tasmania.



Arvie has been a little quiet over the autumn. He's been hibernating on the back seat of the ute somewhere amongst the clutter that accumulates there.



At Easter Arvie made an appearance on the north of the state at low Head just north of George Town on the mouth of the Kanamaluka/Tamar River. This is an area well worth a visit. There are 2 caravan parks in this area, but the pick is the Big4, well looked after with modern clean amenities. A short walk or bike ride will take you into the town centre

There are 2 major attractions, the Pilot Station and the Light House at the river mouth. All part of this maritime precinct.

The pilot station is the oldest and longest active pilot station in Australia, dating back to 1805 and is still active day. The site includes a Maritime Museum with artifacts from an earlier period. You can eat at the Pilot Providore and Kiosk. Most of the old staff housing has been turned into accommodation. Penguin tours leave from near this sight.

The light house has an additional attraction, the Low Head Foghorn that's sounds each Sunday at noon. It is a unique piece of Tasmania's maritime history installed in 1929.

Arvie went exploring in his own back yard at the Kangaroo Bluff battery site, Hobart. The appearance of Russian warships in 1887 prompted the need for this battery to support existing batteries on the other side of the river. Originally surrounded with a moat and a prickly hedge, today it is open for visitor to explore the rock walls and underground passageways.
